RWA Art Gallery

RWA Art Gallery exhibitions are free for refugees and asylum seekers. There is also a Free Family Activity Space with a book corner, puppet theatre, dressing up, and more!

YOU CAN TAKE THE TRAIN FROM BRISTOL TEMPLE MEADS TO CLIFTON DOWN STATION, WHICH IS A 10 MINUTE WALK FROM THE RWA. BUS NUMBERS 8 AND 9 RUN A CONSTANT SERVICE FROM BRISTOL TEMPLE MEADS TO WITHIN 100 METRES THE RWA.



We are Bristol Youth Folk, a voluntary group running morris dance, folk song and craft workshops for children ages 6-17. We also perform at and hold cultural and community events.

Part of our aim is to make folk culture accessible to everyone, and share our traditions freely. We already offer up to fully subsidised spaces to our workshops and ceilidhs, and would love to extend this offer to children from refugee and asylum seeker backgrounds.

WE CAN ALSO OFFER FREE WORKSHOPS TO COMMUNITY GROUPS FROM THESE BACKGROUNDS- WE CAN WORK WITH ORGANISERS TO ENSURE THE EVENT IS SUITABLE, BUT IN PRINCIPLE WWE WOULD HOLD AN HOUR WORKSHOP, SUITABLE FOR ALL AGES AND INVOLVING SIMPLE TRADITIONAL DANCES. ALL LEADERS ARE EXPERIENCED AND HOLD DBS CHECKS. UNFORTUNATELY, WE DO NOT HAVE THE RESOURCES TO PAY FOR TRANSLATION AT THE MOMENT. WE DO ALSO OFFER WORKSHOPS IN A PAID CAPACITY TO SCHOOLS AND LARGER ORGANISATIONS.
