Kirsty will have two vice-chairs: **Ihor Shpykuliak**, an experienced trustee with us, and **Sophie Allen**, who works with our partner in events, the Lichfield Garrick Theatre. We also welcome **David Melhuish** and **Hennadii Driahniev** to the Board. David lives locally and is also a trustee at Curborough Community Centre - another local organisation we work closely with. Hennadii will be known to many of you as a publisher and retailer of books. He is now running weekly martial arts lessons for young people at Curborough as part of our Activities offer. **Alp Tageen Turani** remains as a one of our most experienced trustees - congratulations to him and Shabnam on their second child born in the summer! And we look forward to **Neil Kemp** returning to the Board in January now he has finished his regular work as ESOL trainer - and welcome to **Julia Wright** who is taking over his class from him.

Thanks as always, too, to our Action Group, which has been so admirably led by **Pam Tomlinson** and continues to increase and widen its membership. We are delighted to see an increase in participation from members of our Hong Kong community and from the Masjid.

We have had some major events this year. Our annual summer picnic and games took place at Middleton Hall again - thanks as usual to **Sam Kirman** and her volunteers for their hospitality. The Choir of Sanctuary sang at this year's Lichfield City Council Carol Concert at the Guildhall. Thanks too to **Cathy Lamb** for all her work with them.

And hurrah for the project "*Language to Live and Work in Lichfield*"! This is a major happening with ESOL classes, familiarisation events, speaking clubs and a range of other activities for adults and children - a Saturday club, Art Workshops, Martial Arts for youngsters and trips and visits. The project leader is **Ira Komazova**, ably supported by **Luba Rodionova** and **Veronika Shchetynina** and a host of teachers, leaders and helpers. This is our most ambitious project to date, funded by Shropshire & Staffordshire Community Foundation and supported by Wade Street Church, Curborough Community Centre and Lichfield District Council. It has touched some 250 lives so far, including participants and beneficiaries from Ukraine, Afghanistan, Hong Kong, Egypt, Turkey, Syria, Bangladesh . . . and more! We believe this may be a unique project within our area.

The project has much in common, in its breadth and depth of engagement, with our next big one-off event - "Look Who's Here Too!" Yes, the ultimate in richness and diversity of experience will be returning to The Garrick Theatre on Sunday, 10th May at 11.00am.
