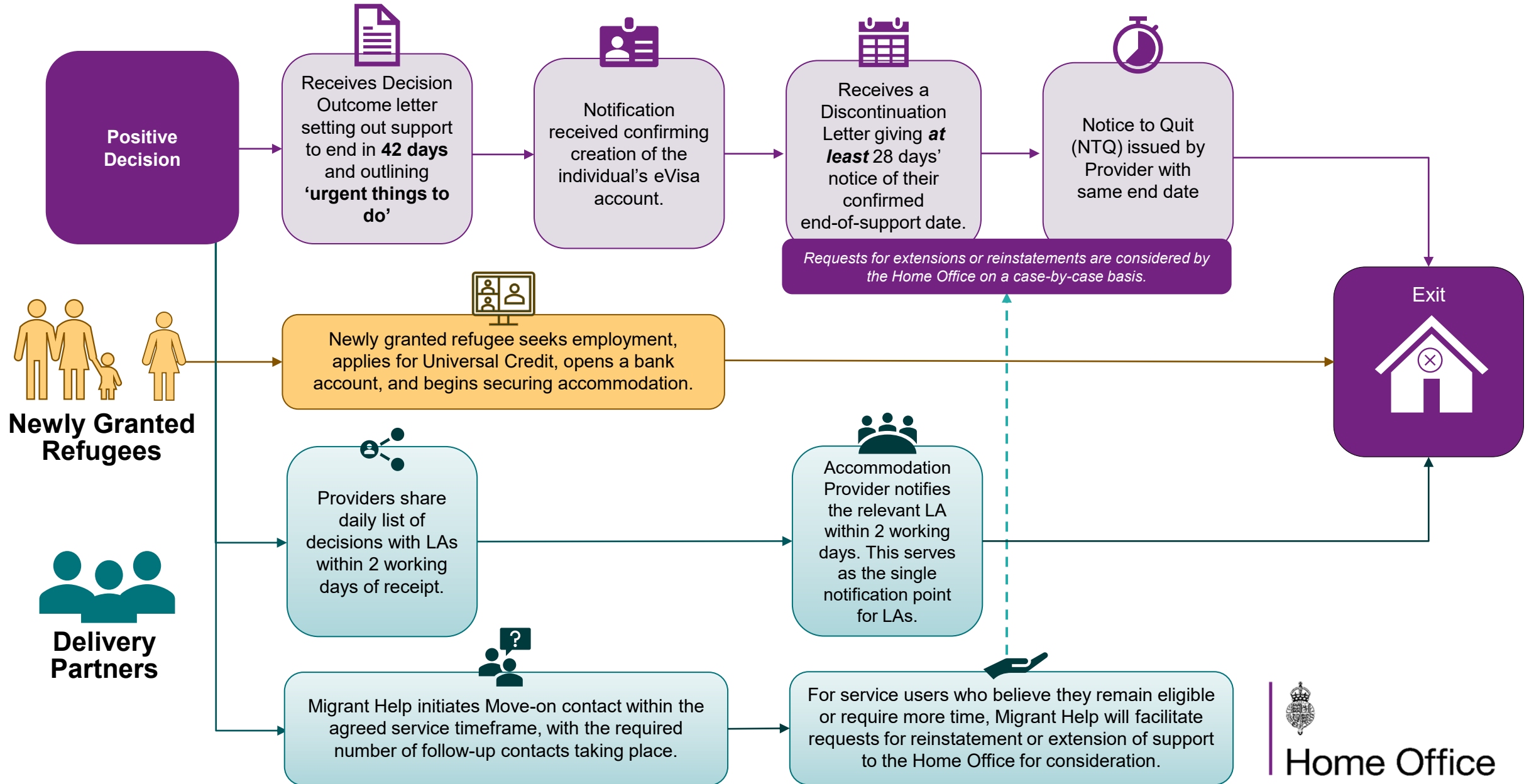


Decision to Exit Process – 42 days

Positive Asylum Decision to Exit Process



Decision made

Digital status is available from the point of decision and can be viewed by Other Government Departments via existing APIs.

The decision letter confirms that **support will cease in 42 days** from the date the individual is notified of their positive asylum decision. It also sets out the key actions they must take to move on, including:

- **Approaching their Local Authority** for housing support and advice.
- **Approaching DWP** to begin their Universal Credit claim and access job-seeking support.

For positive decisions, the Home Office provides a region-split list of cases to Accommodation Providers. **Accommodation Providers then share the relevant cases with Local Authorities within 2 working days of receipt.**

eVisa Account Created

Following a positive decision, **the Home Office creates a UKVI account** for newly granted refugees. They can then access their eVisa and use the 'view and prove' service to share their immigration status, including to:

- **Open a bank account**
- **Generate a Share Code** to prove their right to rent



Discontinuation Notices

An **Asylum Support Discontinuation Letter (ASDL)** is served, providing **at least 28 days' notice** of the individual's support end date.

The **Notice to Vacate (NTV)** is issued by the Home Office to the Accommodation Provider **at the same time** the discontinuation notice is served.

The Accommodation Provider then issues a **Notice to Quit (NTQ)** within **2 working days** of receiving the NTV and sends it to the individual.

The Accommodation Provider also **notifies the relevant Local Authority (LAs)**.

Migrant Help contacts the individual to offer move on support, including advice on Universal Credit, the labour market, and signposting to local authorities for assistance with housing.



AMLOs will provide targeted move on support to newly granted refugees and liaise directly with LAs.
